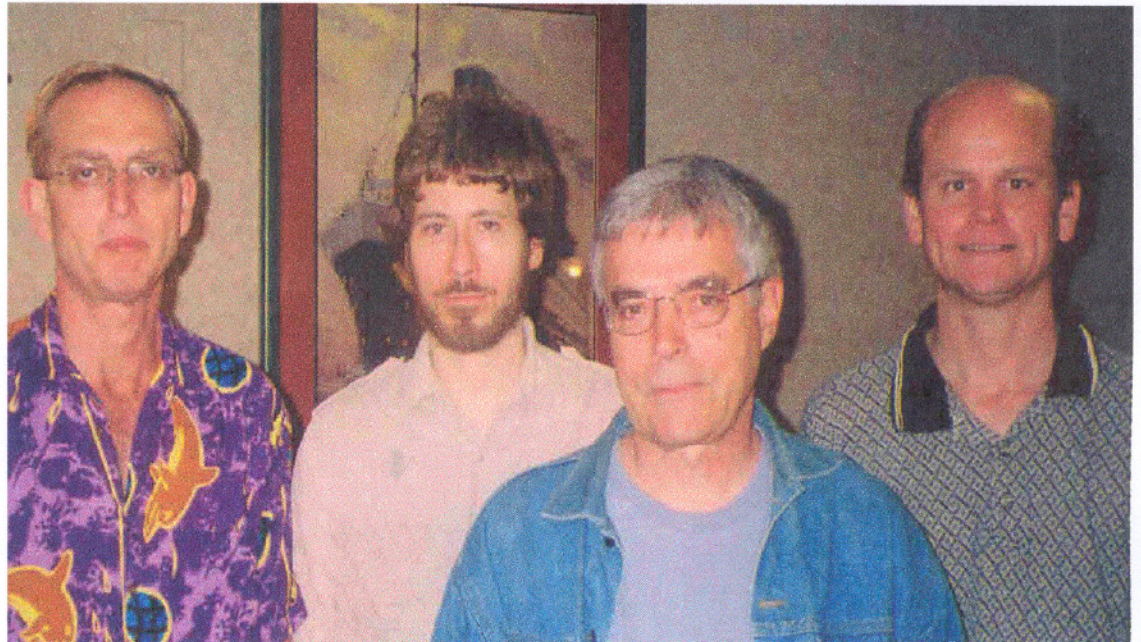

New LPLAC Board poised for active year

Saying that LPLAC is poised to move forward with the officers working well together, out-going Chair **David Larkin** passed the gavel to **Mike Binkley** at the June 17 convention in Hollywood. The new chair, active in South Bay Libertarians Reg

66, had served as Vice Chair for the past two years.

The County convention and election of officers was held on Saturday, June 17, at Denny's Restaurant, 5751 Sunset Blvd. Hollywood. This is the second year that LPLAC has held elections as a County organization. Until February 2004, it had been a loose umbrella organization for the 8 regions that operate within the County of Los Angeles.

After calling the meeting to order, Larkin asked **Ted Brown** of Reg. 63 to conduct the meeting saying that Brown was much better at keeping a meeting going on course. Before Larkin could return to his chair, Brown said he had a memento for him. Together with **Bob Weber** of Reg. 62, Brown presented Larkin with a plaque honoring his "dedicated service" to LPLAC from 2004 to 2006.

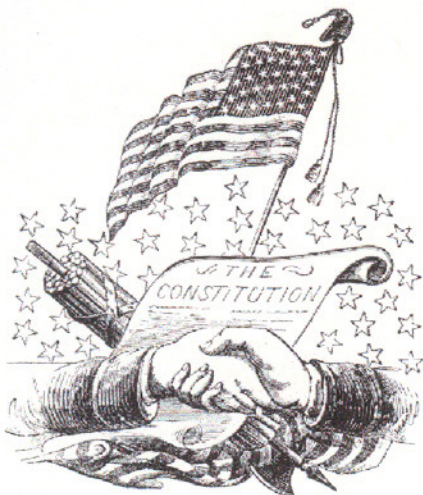
Brown then called for reports from the

officers. **Dave Larkin** iterated his comment that the County party is poised to move forward, that the officers are working well together. (Ed Note: For more on Larkins' comments, read his farewell column on page 2.)

Vice chair **Mike Binkley** had no comment to make.

Secretary **David Bowers** reported on the need to get the minutes of LPLAC meetings on the web site, and promised to get them up as soon as possible.

Treasurer **David Wire** reported that after paying all current bills there was \$7.26 in the treasury plus dues checks that had just been received from various sources. Dues has dropped from \$500 to \$200 per month between October 2005 and March 2006 with the changes made between the state and county parties. He mentioned that donations are welcome, and suggested members join a

What's new at LPLAC?

So, what changes can we expect from the new LPLAC leadership? Will old scores get settled in a purge? Will the new chair institute ring kissing?

Hardly.

LPLAC will be taking advantage of this breakthrough year of 2006 with big new reforms. Reforms will serve two symbiotic objectives:

1. Organize activism around LPLAC-sponsored projects. (Example: projects include an April 15 tax protest and "Welcome, new American", a voter registration outreach effort at local naturalization ceremonies.)

2. Expand the opportunities for LP membership to participate throughout the life-cycle of these projects, in the role of the member's choosing.

The philosophy of the management of officially-sanctioned projects will recapitulate Libertarian political philosophy. Project Managers, for example, will own their projects by assuming full responsibility for fund raising, recruiting, delegating, sched-

pledge program either to LPLAC or to a region. Wire also mentioned that the County owed Larkin \$500 from a loan he had made earlier for a bulk mailing.

Larkin said he wanted to contribute \$250 of that back to the County party. He went on to say that "our newsletter, Los Angeles Libertarian, is by far the best of any. It is on time and excellent. **Dick Venable** is doing a very professional job." Larkin also expressed his appreciation for the great work that **Michael Everling** is doing in assisting the Chair and the County.

Following the officers' reports, Brown called for the election of officers and reminded those present that NOTA (None of the Above) was a choice in the elections. It was also noted that there were 17 voting members present representing 7 regions. Only Reg. 68, Antelope Valley, was not represented.

Larkin nominated Vice Chair **Mike Binkley** as Chair. In his acceptance speech, Binkley said he would unveil a plan similar to one he has proposed for Reg. 66 in furthering activism. (*To see a preview of his plan, turn to the new Chair's column on page 2.*) Binkley was elected by unanimous vote.

Several people declined nominations for the position of Vice Chair before **Thomas M. Sipos**, vice chair of West Los Angeles Reg. 62 said he would accept. He said he would continue his activity of writing Opinion/Editorial articles and Letters to the Editor to try to get the Libertarian name before the public. As LPLAC Vice Chair, he would be writing for a wider market. Sipos received a unanimous vote.

Incumbent Secretary **David Bowers** of Reg. 65 had no opposition and was re-elected by unanimous consent. He reiterated his promise to post the minutes of LPLAC minutes on the web site.

Incumbent Treasurer **David Wire** of Reg. 62 had no opposition and was re-elected by unanimous acclaim. >>>

Surprising facts about private schools

Private schools are good for families, good for kids and good for America, according to the Council for American Private Education (CAPE), an organization that champions American private K-12 education.

But you may be surprised at just "how" beneficial and effective private schools are. According to CAPE:

* One in four U.S. schools is a private school.

* One child in nine attends a private school.

* Private schools produce an annual savings to taxpayers estimated at more than \$48,000,000,000.

* Private school students perform better than their government school counterparts on standardized achievement tests.

* Ninety percent of private high school graduates attend college, compared to 66 percent of government high school graduates.

* Private school students from low socio-economic backgrounds are more than three times more likely than comparable government school students to attain a bachelor's degree by their mid-20s, meaning that private schools contribute to breaking the cycle of poverty for their students.

* Private schools are racially, ethnically, and economically diverse. Twenty-three percent of private school students are students of color; twenty-eight percent are from families with annual incomes under \$50,000.

market of his television show, *Libertarian Alternative*. He said it will soon be on Google Video in a streaming format. He also pointed out that web sites could link easily or embed the show. He also urged the members to use the End the War bumperstickers he had printed up.

Newly-elected Regional Representative of Reg. 64, **José Aguilar**, spoke about the need for people to get involved in their Neighborhood Councils, to become vocal about the increasing use of eminent domain by city redevelopment agencies to take property and sell it to someone to develop the land for a purpose with a higher tax base. He said members should take a more active role in defeating such measures. Outgoing chair **Dave Larkin** reminded Aguilar that he had been appointed Political Action Officer last year, but that he needed to attend meetings regularly to remind the members of current events. Aguilar agreed and apologized for not attending.

Aguilar mentioned another serious issue facing Angelenos: The school governance proposed by LA Mayor **Antonio Villaraigosa** in which the city would take over the troubled school district.

He then went on to say he was considering moving Reg. 64's supper club to a café right across from City Hall, and scheduling meetings to coincide with City Council meetings. That way, the region could meet and then adjourn the meeting so members could attend the council meetings. "That," Aguilar said, "should have an impact on the council members."

Attending from San Luis Obispo County were **Gail Lightfoot**, founding chair of East San Gabriel Valley Reg. 67, and **Richard E. Venable**, publisher of *Los Angeles Libertarian*.

The meeting was adjourned with the time and place of the 2007 convention to be determined. □

Left, Right and Sideways: The Emerging "Fascism"

The Los Angeles politicians are stealing acres of OUR property for corporations. HUGE corporations. Along with OUR money. They call it "redevelopment", "curing blight" or "helping the poor". I call it theft.

"Eminent domain for private gain" has been used since **John D. Rockefeller** used it to take the land from poor homeowners at the site where the "Twin Towers" sat. (Source: **Eric Dartin** - *Divided We Stand*). No one noticed, however, until the infamous "Kelo" case (U.S. Supreme Court - *Kelo v. New London, July 2005*) that affirmed the "right" of cities to use eminent domain to force private property owners to "sell" to corporations (historically at least 20% under fair market value) under the justification of "increased tax revenue", instead of true "public use".

Today in Los Angeles the forced transfer of property from individuals to select corporations is at epic proportions by the 34 redevelopment project areas, including Hollywood.*

Councilman, **Eric Garcetti** (a Democrat and supposed defender of "the little guy") and the Community Redevelopment Agency are forcing 30 businesses at the corner of Hollywood and Vine to "sell" their properties to Westin Hotels and Hei, Inc... and giving the corporations \$180 million of OUR MONEY... to build a luxury hotel, condos and a Hollywood museum. The money is allegedly for the inclusion of seventy-five "affordable" housing units at a cost of a mere \$2.4 million per unit. The "affordable" element ends in 20 years. Do the corporate profits end, then, too?

Now I have nothing against profit. Profit keeps us all fat and happy. I just don't want my tax money used to subsidize corporate profits, thank you very much.

I have some questions:

Why did Bush (Republican and alleged defender of limited government and individual rights) cut individual Section 8 housing subsidies in favor of boondoggle corporate welfare for "affordable" housing projects?

Why did Dem **Hillary Clinton** sit on the board of Walmart until her cover was blown?

Did Dems know that the 2003 corporate welfare Affordable Housing Initiative was singly financed by Century Housing Corp, who claims to be "non-profit" yet trades on the New York Stock Exchange? Did the Dems know that the Affordable Housing Initiative funnels billions into Century Corp's pockets? (source: Brochure to advance Prop 46)

Where's the outcry from both parties about the \$1.5 billion of non-voter-approved debt dumped by the CRA on Angelenos for shopping malls and sports stadiums, which diverts billions away from true public services, such as schools, police and fire stations?

uling, preparing budgets, reporting status, etc.

Participation is also "bottom up". That is, the initiative for creating new projects, for nominating new Project Managers, etc., will come from individual members. Members will be more generous with their time and money if they are earmarked to causes near and dear to individual members' hearts over causes favored by "faceless" LP officials.

LPLAC will support of these projects in several ways. Regional supper clubs and the LPLAC business meetings, held on the fourth Monday of each month, will continue to provide forums for Project Managers to promote their projects.

The LPLAC website (www.LPLAC.org) will be revamped to invite site visitors to volunteer time and money to specific projects. The site's new elements:

- o "Help Wanted" notices detail specific unmet needs of active projects. Requests for volunteers will report the responsibilities of the new position and the requirements for filling the role (e.g., required skills, required time commitment). Requests for funding will include a convenient way for members to give.

- o The Activity Calendar contains key dates for all LPLAC-sanctioned projects.

- o Funding Portals will add convenience for members' funding of projects.

- o Finally, do you have an idea for a new project? If it is ethical, legal and libertarians, you are invited to propose it via a dedicated email form.

Finally, look for future editions of the LA Libertarian to report new opportunities for involvement.
